In 1967 I bought two records from Italian label Joker, featuring banjo player Derroll Adams and guitarist Jack Elliott - American folk singers from the Woody Guthrie neck of the woods.

It was beautiful to hear Adams' banjo and low bass voice contrasted with Elliott's flatpicking and high-pitched voice and it made for terrific harmonies.

In 1969 I met Joost Belinfante, who was likewise a fan of those records I mentioned. Together we formed the band CCC Inc. and in our early days we frequented and performed at the infamous 'De Muze' venue in Antwerp, with an early repertoire that many say owed a lot to the music of Derroll Adams.

Adams was the first real banjo player I met and I learned from him the unique way of playing that is so characteristic his music. The only other banjo player who (in my view) comes close is folklorist Bascom Lamar (1882-1973). The type of basic strum with characteristic hammeron, alternating one/two fingerpicking is gorgeously featured on this record.








